A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF MUNICIPAL COURTS, THE RULE OF LAW, AND THE FAIR AND IMPARTIAL ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

WHEREAS, municipal courts play a significant role in preserving public safety and promoting quality of life in Texas:

WHEREAS, more people come in contact with municipal courts than all other Texas courts combined and public impression of the Texas judicial system is largely dependent upon the public's experience in municipal court;

WHEREAS, the City of Lockhart hosts the Lockhart Municipal Court;

WHEREAS, state law authorizes a municipality to either appoint or elect a municipal judge for a term of office, the Lockhart Municipal Court is a state court and its judges are members of the state judiciary;

WHEREAS, the procedures for the Lockhart Municipal Court operations are set forth in the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure and other laws of the State of Texas;

WHEREAS, the City of Lockhart is committed to the notion that our legal system is based on the principle that an independent, fair, and competent judiciary will interpret and apply the laws that govern us and that judges and court personnel should comply with the law and act in a manner that promotes public confidence in the integrity and impartiality of the judiciary;

WHEREAS, Lockhart Municipal Judges are not policy makers for the City of Lockhart but are bound by the law and the Canons of Judicial Conduct and are required to make decisions independent of the governing body of the City Council, city officials, and employees;

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas contain procedural safeguards in criminal cases for all defendants, including indigent defendants, and supports the Lockhart Municipal Court in complying with such legal requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS THAT THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 7 – 11, 2016 IS HEREBY RECOGNIZED AS MUNICIPAL COURT WEEK IN RECOGNITION OF THE FAIR AND IMPARTIAL JUSTICE OFFERED TO OUR CITIZENS BY THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF LOCKHART.

The owner anticipates using the subject property to build an eight-unit multi-family complex, which requires both rezoning to RHD and a subsequent specific use permit to allow the MF-2 residential development type for a density of more than 12 units per acre. In terms of neighborhood compatibility, there are several other multifamily developments within one block to the east and west along San Antonio Street as well as the two complexes north of the subject parcel. The adjacent The Elms Apartments has a density of 35 units per acre, and The Oaks Apartments north of The Elms has a density of 28 units per acre. If the applicant follows through with the plan to develop eight units on the subject property upon approval of a specific use permit for the MF-2 Development Type, the density will be only 16 units per acre. Other apartment complexes within a one block radius include the Westwood Apartments, Lockhart Senior Apartments, The Greens Apartments, and the Vintage Apartments. The requested RHD zoning classification is not consistent with the Medium Density Residential future land use map designation of the property. However, it is still a residential zoning classification, and is the same as the existing RHD zoning adjacent to the north. Thus far, there has been no opposition to this proposed zoning change. ORDINANCE 2016-28

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, TO RECLASSIFY THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS PART OF LOT 1, BLOCK 48, ORIGINAL TOWN OF LOCKHART, CONSISTING OF 0.492 ACRE LOCATED AT 601 WEST SAN ANTONIO STREET (SH 142), FROM RMD RESIDENTIAL MEDIUM DENSITY DISTRICT TO RHD RESIDENTIAL HIGH DENSITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2016, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing and voted unanimously to recommend approval of said change; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the zoning map accordingly as provided in Section 64-128 of the Code of Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in conformance with applicable law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, THAT:

- 1. The above-referenced property described in Zoning Change request ZC-16-07 as Part of Lot 1, Block 48, Original Town of Lockhart, consisting of 0.492 acre more particularly described in Exhibit A and located at 601 West San Antonio Street (SH 142), will be reclassified from RMD Residential Medium Density District to RHD Residential High Density District.
- II. Severability: If any provision, section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforced, the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or its application shall not be affected, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting and of the Mayor in approving this ordinance that no portion, provision, or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by way of reasons of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion, provision or regulation.
- III. Repealer: That all other ordinances, sections, or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the City of Lockhart in conflict with the provisions set out above in this ordinance are hereby repealed or amended as indicated.
- IV. Publication: That the City Secretary is directed to cause this ordinance caption to be published in a newspaper of general circulation according to law.
- V. Effective Date: That this ordinance shall become effective and be in full force immediately upon and from the date of its passage.





BACKGROUND DATA

APPLICANT(S): Thom Earnest OWNER(S): Kalpesh Gohel

SITE LOCATION: 601 W. San Antonio Street

LEGAL DESCRIPTION: Part of Lot 1, Block 48, Original Town of Lockhart

SIZE OF PROPERTY: 0.492 acre

EXISTING USE OF PROPERTY: Vacant lot

LAND USE PLAN DESIGNATION: Medium Density Residential

ANALYSIS OF ISSUES

REASON FOR REQUESTED CHANGE: The owner anticipates using the subject property to build an eightunit multi-family complex, which requires both rezoning to RHD and a subsequent specific use permit to allow the MF-2 residential development type for a density of more than 12 units per acre.

AREA CHARACTERISTICS:

TRANSITION OF ZONING DISTRICTS: The lots directly across the street to the east and south are zoned commercial, with CMB to the east and CLB to the south. RHD zoning is directly north of the subject property, and RMD is on the west side. Beyond the properties in the immediate vicinity of the subject property, a mixture of CLB, CMB, and RHD exist on the east side as West San Antonio approaches downtown Lockhart. A mixture of RHD and RMD zoning exists west of the subject property. RHD zoning is consistent with the site context and existing zoning adjacent to the north of the subject property. In addition, the RHD classification provides an appropriate transition from the commercial uses and zoning to the east of the subject property, and the residential uses and zoning to the west.

ADEQUACY OF INFRASTRUCTURE: Existing street access and utilities are adequate. According to the Water/Wastewater superintendent, the existing water and wastewater lines are sufficient for the proposed use.

POTENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD IMPACT: The maximum number of units allowed by-right on the subject property would be a multi-family building containing five units on the original parcel, or three duplexes containing a total of six units if platted into three lots facing Elm Street. The RHD district would also allow up to 11 multifamily units upon approval of a specific use permit for the MF-2 development type. Therefore a maximum of five to 11 units would be allowed if rezoned to RHD, depending on whether or not a specific use permit is required. In terms of neighborhood compatibility, there are several other multifamily developments within one block to the east and west along San Antonio Street as well as the two complexes north of the subject parcel. The adjacent The Elms Apartments has a density of 35 units per acre, and The Oaks Apartments north of The Elms has a density of 28 units per acre. If the applicant follows through with the plan to develop eight units on the subject property upon approval of a specific use permit for the MF-2 Development Type, the density will be only 16 units per acre. Other apartment complexes within a one block radius include the Westwood Apartments, Lockhart Senior Apartments, The Greens Apartments, and the Vintage Apartments.

CONSISTENCY WITH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: The requested RHD zoning classification is not consistent with the Medium Density Residential future land use map designation of the property. However, it is still a residential zoning classification, and is the same as the existing RHD zoning adjacent to the north.

ALTERNATIVE CLASSIFICATIONS: Based on the surveyed dimensions of the subject property, if it remains a single parcel the current RMD classification would allow a single-family dwelling or duplex by-right, or a multifamily building containing up to four units upon approval of a specific use permit for the CF-1 residential development type. If it is subdivided into three lots facing Elm Street, a single-family dwelling would be allowed by-right on each lot for a total of three units, or a duplex would be allowed on each lot for a total of six units upon approval of a specific use permit for the DF-2 development type. Therefore, a maximum of two to six units is possible on the subject property, depending upon whether or not it is subdivided and whether or not a specific use permit is required.

RESPONSE TO NOTIFICATION: Public hearing notices were mailed to 11 owners of property within 200 feet of the subject property, including the City. No opposition has been expressed either in writing or in person at the Planning and Zoning Commission, although one caller asked what uses are allowed in the RHD district but did not state any opinion.

Work Session 6:30 p.m.

Mayor White opened the work session and advised the Council, staff and the audience that staff would provide information and explanations about the following items:

DISCUSSION ONLY

A. DISCUSS MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF OCTOBER 4, 2016.

Mayor White requested corrections to the minutes. There were none.

B. DISCUSS PROPOSED CLINICAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TEXAS A&M ENGINEERING EXTENSION SERVICE (TEEX) AND THE CITY OF LOCKHART – CALDWELL COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS) TO ALLOW STUDENTS TO RIDE ON EMS UNITS FOR REQUIRED CLINICAL EXPERIENCE TO PROMOTE EXCELLENCE IN PATIENT CARE, TO ENSURE PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE, AND TO PROVIDE MAXIMUM UTILIZATION OF COMMUNITY RESOURCES, AND APPOINTING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT, IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that the proposed agreement allows TEEX students to ride with Lockhart EMS units to gain required experience in pursuing excellence in patient care, to promote professional competence, and to provide maximum utilization of community resources. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval and stated that these students could be our next generation of Paramedics. There was discussion.

C. DISCUSS RECOMMENDATION TO THE CALDWELL COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT TO CONSIDER APPOINTMENT OF DAN GIBSON, CITY PLANNER, TO THE CAPITAL AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (CAMPO) TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE AS THE REPRESENTATIVE FROM CITIES WITHIN CALDWELL COUNTY.

Mr. Rodgers stated that recent changes at CAMPO result in only one appointment on the Technical Advisory Committee from cities within Caldwell County with that appointment coming from the Caldwell County Commissioner's Court. Dan Gibson, City Planner, has served commendably on the Technical Advisory Committee. Mr. Rodgers requested that Council consider recommending to the Commissioner's Court that Mr. Gibson be appointed to serve on the Technical Advisory Committee. There was discussion.

D. DISCUSS THE 4TH QUARTER FISCAL YEAR 2016 INVESTMENT REPORT.

Mr. Hinson stated that the Texas Public Investment Act requires local governments to review and accept a Quarterly Investment Report for each quarterly reporting period of the year. He provided information and there was brief discussion about the 4th Quarter 2016 Investment report ending September 30, 2016.

E. DISCUSS ANNUAL AUDIT OF CHAPTER 59 ASSET FORFEITURE FUNDS OF THE LOCKHART POLICE DEPARTMENT TO BE REPORTED TO THE TEXAS ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Mr. Hinson stated that any law enforcement agency that has the authority to receive property forfeited under Chapter 59 of the Code of Criminal Procedures is required to file an annual asset forfeiture reporting form with the Office of the Attorney General. The statutory definition of law enforcement agency includes any agency that has the authority to hire peace officers and receive property. The Lockhart Police Department fits that definition. The report must account for every seizure, forfeiture, receipt, and specific expenditure of all proceeds in an annual audit. Mr. Hinson recommended approval of the report that would include the activity of interest and one asset forfeiture for the period beginning October 1, 2015 and ending September 30, 2016. There was discussion

F. DISCUSS CONFIRMATION OF CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION MEMBER; REAPPOINTMENT OF DOUG SHOMETTE FOR A THREE YEAR TERM AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CITY MANAGER.

Mr. Rodgers stated that Mr. Shomette has served on the Commission for the past 10 years. According to Civil Service regulations, he can be reappointed for an additional 3-year term if the appointment is confirmed by a two-third majority vote of the City Council. Mr. Shomette has graciously agreed to continue serving on the commission. Mr. Rodgers stated that he and the Civil Service Director concurs that Mr. Shomette has been an asset to the Commission and recommends reappointed.

G. DISCUSS CHANGE ORDER #1 FOR QRO-MEX CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC., TO INCREASE THE CURRENT CONTRACT BY \$359,412 MAKING THE NEW CONTRACT AMOUNT \$2,108,665 FOR DRAINAGE, UTILITY, AND ROAD IMPROVEMENTS ON EAST WALNUT STREET BETWEEN CITY PARK AND CARVER STREET AND ON THE EAST MARKET STREET DRAINAGE AREA, AND APPOINTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE CHANGE ORDER, IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that Qro-Mex Construction Company, Inc. has the current contract to perform utility, drainage, and street improvements on the Richland Drive project and on the Mesquite-Braden-Vega-Wichita Street project; the unit prices for the week were very good. The contractor has agreed to extend the same unit prices for the proposed change order. The total current contract is \$1,749,253.

The proposed Change Order #1 would add \$359,412 to the current contract to construct drainage and street improvements on East Walnut Street, West of Carver Street and to make drainage improvements on the south side of East Market Street east of the railroad tracks. The increase in the contract, if approved, would be 20.5% (State law allows up to 25% increase without re-bidding). The new contract amount, if change order #1 is approved, will then be \$2,108,665. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval.

H. DISCUSS ADDITIONAL FUNDS AMENDMENT (AFA) FOR US 183 CSJS 0152-02-070 WIDENING PROJECT WHICH INCLUDES FUNDING FROM CAPITAL AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (CAMPO) AND FROM THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TXDOT), AND APPOINTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT, IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that the construction change order to place all drainage underground for Phase II, Blackjack to Walmart on US 183, is estimated at \$2.35 million by TxDOT. With the additional \$2.8 million in CAMPO funding and the additional \$1.0 million in TxDOT support funding, the change order should be covered. The amended agreement reflects these figures. If for some reason the project exceeds the amount of funding available, the City of Lockhart will be responsible for the overage. TxDOT will keep the City aware of any additional change orders and provide the City with an opportunity for review and/or possible changes to reduce any projected overages. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval.

PRESENTATION ONLY

A. PRESENTATION OF APPRECIATION TO POLICE CHIEF MICHAEL LUMMUS FOR HIS SERVICE AND TO WISH HIM WELL IN HIS FUTURE ENDEAVORS AFTER HIS RETIREMENT EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 31, 2016.

Mayor White and the Council presented a shadow box to Michael Lummus thanking him for his service as the Chief of Police for the past 10 years and wished him well in his future endeavors.

Chief Lummus thanked the Council, the Lockhart Police Department, EMS, Fire, City staff, and many other state, county and local elected officials for their support during his tenure.

Margaret Moore, Travis County District Attorney, presented Chief Lummus with a proclamation on behalf of Kirk Watson, State Senator recognizing Chief Lummus' dedication and extensive experience in law enforcement.

LeeAnn Callaway of Congressman Lloyd Doggett's office thanked Chief Lummus for his service.

RECESS: Mayor White announced that the Council would recess for refreshments at 7:02 p.m.

The Council briefly left the Council Chambers during the break to see the new ambulance that was located outside of the building.

REGULAR MEETING

ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER.

Mayor Lew White called the regular meeting of the Lockhart City Council to order on this date at 7:33 p.m.

ITEM 2. INVOCATION, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

Invocation - Ministerial Alliance.

Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and Texas flags.

ITEM 3. CITIZENS/VISITORS COMMENTS.

Mayor White requested citizens to address the Council.

Charles Johnson, 717 Trinity Street, requested that Trinity Street be patrolled more often to diminish or stop speeding. He stated that because the drivers are using Trinity Street as an alternate to Highway 183, traffic has increased and has become more dangerous with drivers speeding and being careless.

Mayor White requested additional citizens to address the Council. There were none.

ITEM 4-A. HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING ON APPLICATION ZC-16-06 BY JANEY MAE EVANS FOR A ZONING CHANGE FROM AO AGRICULTURAL-OPEN SPACE DISTRICT TO CHB COMMERCIAL HEAVY BUSINESS DISTRICT FOR 11.133 ACRES IN THE ESTHER BERRY SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 1, LOCATED AT 2112 SOUTH COLORADO STREET (US 183).

Mayor White opened the public hearing at 7:40 p.m. and requested the staff report.

Mr. Gibson stated that the subject property, which is located across the highway from the municipal airport and livestock auction barn, was formerly the site of an automobile salvage yard that is now closed. The applicant anticipates a variety of future uses that will require a commercial zoning classification. There is a single-family dwelling on property currently zoned AO adjacent to the north, but the remainder of the land uses in the area are commercial or institutional in nature. Although not immediately abutting the subject property, there is existing CHB zoning nearby, both to the north and to the south. The CHB classification is consistent with the Lockhart 2020 Land Use Plan map, which shows a strip along the east side of the highway designated as future General-Heavy Commercial. The eastern corner of the subject property extends beyond that strip into an area designated as future Medium Density Residential, so that would be a minor deviation from the land use plan. Thus far, there has been no opposition to this proposed zoning change. Mr. Gibson stated that the Planning and Zoning Commission and staff recommend approval.

Mayor White requested the applicant to address the Council.

Janey Mae Evans, 7052 Highway 142, stated that she proposes to build a commercial business park to offer a variety of businesses, including a daycare. She requested approval.

Mayor White requested citizens in favor of or against the proposed zoning change to address the Council. There were none. He closed the public hearing at 7:42 p.m.

ITEM 4-B. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION TO CONSIDER ORDINANCE 2016-27 AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, TO RECLASSIFY THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS 11.133 ACRES IN THE ESTHER BERRY SURVEY, ABSTRACT NUMBER 1, LOCATED AT 2112 SOUTH COLORADO STREET (US 183), FROM AO AGRICULTURAL-OPEN SPACE DISTRICT TO CHB COMMERCIAL HEAVY BUSINESS DISTRICT.

Mayor Pro-Tem Sanchez made a motion to approve Ordinance 2016-27, as presented. Councilmember Michelson seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

ITEM 5. CONSENT AGENDA.

Mr. Gruning requested that consent agenda item 5B be pulled for further discussion.

Councilmember Castillo made a motion to approve consent agenda items 5A, 5C, 5D, 5E, 5F, 5G and 5H. Mayor Pro-Tem Sanchez seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

The following are the consent agenda items that were approved:

- 5A: Approve minutes of the City Council meeting of October 4, 2016.
- 5C: Approve recommendation to the Caldwell County Commissioner's Court to consider appointment of Dan Gibson, City Planner, to the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) Technical Advisory Committee as the representative from cities within Caldwell County.
- 5D: Accept the 4th Quarter Fiscal Year 2016 Investment Report.
- 5E: Approve annual audit of Chapter 59 Asset Forfeiture Funds of the Lockhart Police Department to be reported to the Texas Attorney General.
- 5F: Approve confirmation of Civil Service Commission member; reappointment of Doug Shomette for a three year term as recommended by the City Manager.
- 5G: Approve Change Order #1 for Qro-Mex Construction Company, Inc., to increase the current contract by \$359,412 making the new contract amount \$2,108,665 for drainage, utility, and road improvements on East Walnut Street between City Park and Carver Street and on the East Market Street drainage area, and appointing the Mayor to sign the change order, if approved.

Mayor White requested appointments to various boards, commissions or committees.

Mayor White made a motion to appoint Larry Metzler to the Lockhart ETJ Impact Fee Advisory Committee. Councilmember Hilburn seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 7-0.

Councilmember Michelson made a motion to remove Mary Beth Nickel from the Lockhart Economic Development Revolving Loan Committee and to appoint Ms. Nickel to the Planning and Zoning Commission. Mayor Pro-Tem Sanchez seconded. The motion passed by a vote of 7-0.



The following a	are NOTES regarding appointments to several boards that have certain criteria that should be met, such as qualifications or number to serve on the board. Boards that are not listed below have a seven member board and are open to any citizen without qualifications.
NOTES: AIRPORT ADVISORY BOARD	Sec. 4-26. Membership; appointments. The Lockhart Airport Advisory Board shall be composed of seven members to be appointed in accordance with section 2-210. At least five members must currently be or have been flight rated, and two members may be appointed as at-large members. Members shall serve three-year terms, such terms coinciding with the council position making the appointment. Sec. 4-28. Eligibility for board membership. No person having a financial interest in any commercial carrier by air, or in any concession, right or privilege to conduct any business or render any service for compensation upon the premises of the Lockhart Municipal Airport shall be eligible for membership on the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board. Sec. 4-32. Limitations of authority. The Lockhart Municipal Airport Advisory Board shall not have authority to incur or create any debt in connection with airport operations; nor shall the board be empowered to enter into any contract, leases, or other legal obligations binding upon the City of Lockhart; nor shall the board have authority to hire airport personnel or direct airport personnel in the execution of their duties.
NOTES: CONSTRUCTIO N BOARD APPOINTMENTS	Section B101.4, Board Decision, is amended to read as follows: The construction board of adjustments and appeals shall have the power, as further defined in Appendix B, to hear appeals of decisions and interpretations of the building official and consider variances of the technical codes; and to conduct hearings on determinations of the building official regarding unsafe or dangerous buildings, structures and/or service systems, and to issue orders in accordance with the procedures beginning with section 12-442 of this Code [of Ordinances]. Section B101.2, Membership of Board, is amended to read as follows: Each District Council member and the Mayor shall appoint one member to the Construction Board of Appeals making it a five (5) member board and each Councilmember at Large shall appoint an alternate. The term of office of the board members shall be three (3) years, such terms coinciding with the council position making the appointments. The two (2) alternates shall also serve the term coinciding with the council position making the appointments. Vacancies shall be filled for an unexpired term in the manner in which the original appointments are required to be made. Board members shall consist of members who are qualified by experience and/or training to pass on matters pertaining to building construction and are not employees of the City of Lockhart.
NOTES: ELECTRIC BOARD APPOINTMENTS	Sec. 12-132. Members. (a) Appointments to the examining and supervisory board of electricians and appeals shall conform to section 2-210 except that the board shall consist of five persons with one being appointed by each district council member and one by the mayor. Each member shall serve three-year terms with such terms to coincide with the council position making the appointment. (b) Each board member shall reside within the county and such board shall include one member who shall be a building contractor, one layman; two members shall be master electricians who are currently licensed by the city; and one member shall be either a building contractor or master electrician licensed by the city. There shall be two ex-officio members, one who shall be the city electrical inspector, and one shall be the fire marshal. Sec. 12-133. Officers and quorum. The members of the examining and supervising board of electricians and appeals shall select a chairman and secretary. A quorum shall consist of three members.
NOTES: HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION	Sec. 28-3. Historical preservation commission. (b) The commission shall consist of seven members, appointed by the city council in accordance with section 2-210, who shall whenever possible meet one or more of the following qualities: (1) A registered architect, planner or representative of a design profession, (2) A registered professional engineer in the State of Texas, (3) A member of a nonprofit historical organization of Caldwell County, (4) A local licensed real estate broker or member of the financial community, (5) An owner of an historic landmark residential building, (6) An owner or tenant of a business property that is an historic landmark or in an historic district, (7) A member of the Caldwell County Historical Commission.
NOTES: PARKS ADVISORY BOARD	Sec. 40-133. Members. (a) The board shall consist of seven members appointed in accordance with section 2-210 to serve three years terms, such terms to coincide with the council position making the appointment and two alternates shall also be appointed by the mayor and mayor pro-term, one each. The two alternates shall also serve the term coinciding with the council position making the appointments. Vacancies shall be filed for an unexpired term in the manner in which the original appointments are required to be made. (Ordinance 06-08, adopted February 7, 2006)

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Sec. 2-209. - Rules for appointment.

The city council hereby sets the following rules:

- (1) Except as may be established by existing city ordinances/resolutions the process for selecting members shall be open to all Lockhart citizens, who must apply for appointment, to include those applying for reappointment. Reappointment shall not be deemed automatic.
- (2) Council shall seek to appoint the most qualified or best persons available, while also respecting the need for diverse community opinions.
- (3) No member of any appointed body shall serve on more than one quasi-judicial or advisory board or commission.
- (4) No appointed body shall deviate from its charge, deliberate items not on its agendas, or speak for the council or City of Lockhart without council authorization.
- (5) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.
- (6) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County, to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.

Section 2-210. Method of selection: number of members: terms.

- (a) The mayor and city councilmembers shall nominate individuals to serve on boards and commissions. Each nomination shall then be confirmed by a simple majority of the entire city council.
- (b) Except as provided herein, there shall be seven members appointed to each board or commission corresponding with the seven members or places of the city council. Each city councilmember, except at provided herein, shall nominate a qualified person to serve in a place on an appointed body corresponding to their place on the council. At-large councilmembers shall be designated as places 5 and 6, and the mayor's position as place 7, for the purpose of this section. Nominations shall be made to fill vacant positions and/or positions whose terms have expired within 90 days of the event, such as a resignation or an election. Should any city councilmember fail to name an appointee to one of his/her corresponding places on any body within the above described 90 days, another councilmember shall then have the privilege to nominate a person to fill that same position, as described in subsection (a). However, once that position becomes vacant again for any reason, the appointment shall revert to the place corresponding with the original city council seat/place number for nominations.
- (c) Beginning with the election in May, 1998, the council shall nominate and confirm four members to serve in places 1, 2, 5, 6 on each board and commission in accordance with subsections (a) and (b) above, and with the standards set in Ordinance Number 97-09, Governance Policies. With the election of May, 1999, the remaining three places shall be filled following the same procedure as above.
- (d)Terms of service on appointed bodies shall be the same three-year terms as the councilmember who nominates a person to serve. However, a person may be appointed to complete the unexpired term of a vacant position, due to a resignation, for example.
- (e) When a person has completed a term, or terms, of service and will be vacating a place, that person may continue to serve until a replacement is nominated and confirmed by the city council.
- (f) At the discretion of the majority of the city council, one Caldwell County resident who is also an owner of real property within any local historic district may be appointed as a full member to the historical preservation commission.
- (g) Exceptions to the above regulations shall be all volunteer/special purpose/ad hoc committees appointed from time to time by the city council and the zoning board of adjustments, whose members shall serve two-year terms in accordance with V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.008. All other provisions of this section, and ordinance number 97-09 which do not conflict with the chapters establishing these bodies shall be applicable.

Sec. 2-212. Removal and resignation of members.

- (a) All board, commission and committee members serve at the pleasure of the city council and may be removed from office with or without cause at the discretion of the city council.
- (b) Board, commission and committee members may resign from office at any time by filing a written resignation, dated and signed by the member, with the City Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the City Secretary without further action by the city council. If the city council appoints a new member to replace the resigned member, the new member shall be appointed to serve out the remainder of the resigned member's term.
