The applicant desires to establish an electrical contractor office and storage facility on the subject tract. There is no industrial or commercial zoning in the vicinity. However, on the south side of Maple Street, east of SH 130, there is a large tract zoned PDD for which the PDD development plan includes areas designated for commercial and light industrial land uses. The only existing development in the area other than the electrical substation across the street is the single-family dwelling on the south side of Maple Street, approximately 500 feet west of the subject tract. Because traffic generated by development on the subject tract will likely use only the portion of Maple Street between the driveway and Cesar Chavez Parkway (SH 130 frontage road), it will not affect the portion of the street abutting the residential property. Various other impacts could be expected by uses allowed in the IL district, but the generally rural nature of the area on the west side of SH 130 minimizes the chances of a negative affect on existing development. The highway, itself, provides a significant buffer for any development on the east side. The requested IL zoning classification is not consistent with the Lockhart 2020 Future Land Use Plan map, which designates the subject tract as Parks and Open Space, Agriculture/Rural Development, and Floodplain. The Parks and Open Space designation is meant to be part of a greenbelt containing a hike and bike trail along the west side of SH 130. The trail is shown in the Lockhart 2020 Comprehensive Plan Maps, so the applicant or owner will be required to construct the segment abutting the property in order to comply with the subdivision standards. No opposition to the zoning change has been expressed as of this date. More information is available in the attached staff report.

#### ORDINANCE 2017-02

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, TO RECLASSIFY THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS 6.677 ACRES IN THE FRANCIS BERRY SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 2, LOCATED AT 2201 MAPLE STREET, FROM AO AGRICULTURAL—OPEN SPACE DISTRICT TO IL INDUSTRIAL LIGHT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, on January 11, 2017, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing and voted 4-1 to recommend approval of said change; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the zoning map as provided in Section 64-128 of the Code of Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in conformance with applicable law;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, THAT:

The above-referenced property described in Zoning Change request ZC-17-03 as 6.677 acres in the Francis Berry Survey, Abstract No. 2, more particularly described in Exhibit A and located at 2201 Maple Street, will be reclassified from AO Agricultural—Open Space District to IL Industrial Light District.
- II. Severability: If any provision, section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforced, the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or its application shall not be affected, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting and of the Mayor in approving this ordinance that no portion, provision, or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by way of reasons of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion, provision or regulation.
- III. Repealer: That all other ordinances, sections, or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the City of Lockhart in conflict with the provisions set out above in this ordinance are hereby repealed or amended as indicated.
- IV. Publication: That the City Secretary is directed to cause this ordinance caption to be published in a newspaper of general circulation according to law.
- V. Effective Date: That this ordinance shall become effective and be in full force immediately upon and from the date of its passage.

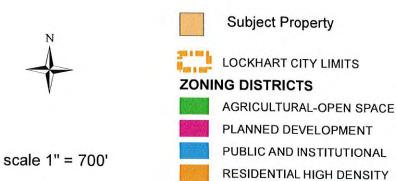

#### **ANALYSIS OF ISSUES**

REASON FOR REQUESTED CHANGE: The applicant desires to establish an electrical contractor office and storage facility on the subject tract. It is not a retail operation and, therefore, does not require a commercial zoning classification.

TRANSITION OF ZONING DISTRICTS: There is no industrial zoning, nor any commercial zoning, in the vicinity. However, on the south side of Maple Street, east of SH 130, is a large tract zoned PDD for which the PDD development plan includes areas designated for commercial and light industrial land uses.

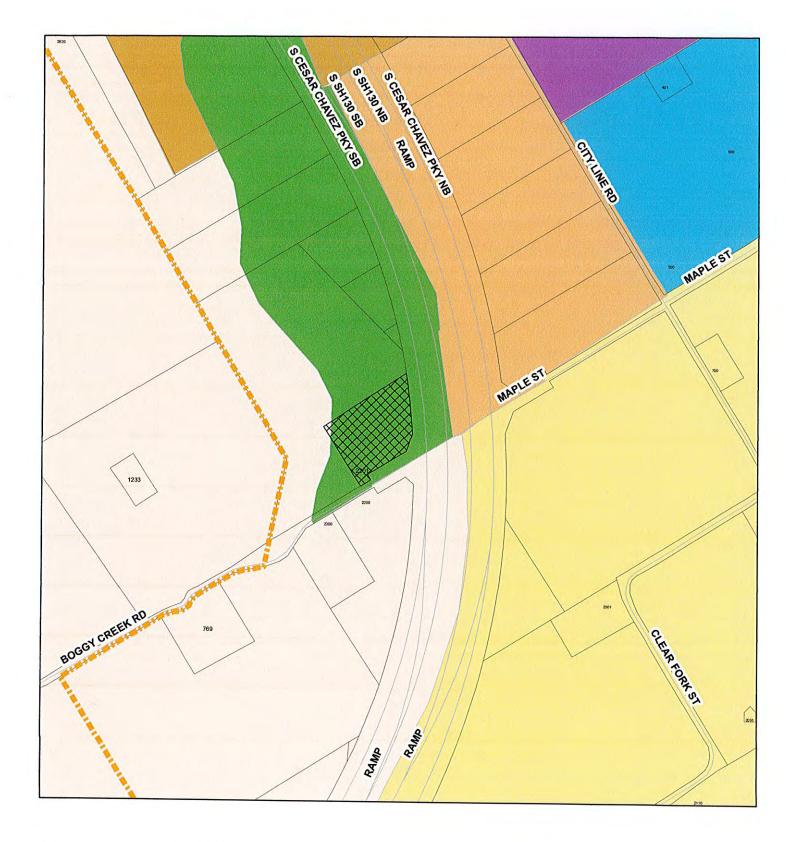
ADEQUACY OF INFRASTRUCTURE: Vehicular access will be from a driveway on Maple Street, in line with the existing driveway to the electrical substation on the south side of the street. The subdivision standards will require that the owner or applicant upgrade the unpaved portion of the street to City standards from the driveway location to the end of the existing paved extension from Cesar Chavez Parkway (SH 130), a distance of approximately 210 feet, or apply for a subdivision variance. City water is available, but because there is no wastewater service in this area a septic tank will have to be used.

POTENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD IMPACT: The only existing development in the area other than the electrical substation across the street is the single-family dwelling on the south side of Maple Street, approximately 500 feet west of the subject tract. Because traffic generated by development on the subject tract will likely use only the portion of Maple Street between the driveway and Cesar Chavez Parkway, it will not affect the portion of the street abutting the residential property. Various other impacts could be expected by uses allowed in the IL district, but the generally rural nature of the area on the west side of SH 130 minimizes the chances of a negative affect. The highway, itself, provides a significant buffer for any development on the east side.

CONSISTENCY WITH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: The requested IL zoning classification is not consistent with the Lockhart 2020 Future Land Use Plan map, which designates the subject tract as Parks and Open Space, Agriculture/Rural Development, and Floodplain. The Parks and Open Space designation is meant to be part of a greenbelt containing a hike and bike trail along the west side of SH 130. The trail is shown on the future land use plan, thoroughfare plan, and sidewalk/trail plan maps, so the applicant or owner will be required to construct the segment abutting the property in order to comply with the subdivision standards.

ALTERNATIVE CLASSIFICATIONS: There are no less intense zoning classifications, except perhaps a commercial classification, that would accommodate the intended use. However, commercial districts allow uses that can generate higher traffic volumes than most industrial uses, so the light industrial classification is most appropriate if the zoning is to be changed from its current AO classification.

RESPONSE TO NOTIFICATION: Public hearing notices were mailed to the only two other owners of property within 200 feet, and no comments have been received as of the date of this report.

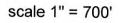

Considering the size of the event (800 cars) and number of out of town visitors (estimated 10,000 plus) for the planned 2017 Hot Rods and Hatters Car Show, it is requested that Council consider using up to \$4,500 for expenses to be paid directly to a vendor used at the event such as for portable hand washing and restroom facilities. Council approved a similar expense when the Kart Races were held in Lockhart. Council previously approved 8.7% (estimated at \$4,961) of Hotel Occupancy Tax which can be used for advertising to help attract out of town visitors to this event.

There was discussion about whether to authorize allocating \$4,500 towards the Hot Rod and Hatters Car Show. Mayor White stated that the decision will be made during the regular meeting.

RECESS: Mayor White announced that the Council would recess for a break at 7:25 p.m.

# RESOLUTION TO NOTIFY TAXING UNITS OF VACANCY ON BOARD OF DIRECTORS

WHEREAS, one (1) vacancy has occurred on the Caldwell County Appraisal District Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, §6.03(1) of the Texas Tax Code provides for notification by the Board of Directors to each taxing unit that is entitled to vote for director of the vacancy; and

WHEREAS, §6.03 of the Code provides that each eligible taxing unit may nominate by resolution adopted by its governing body a candidate to fill the vacancy, and such taxing unit shall submit its nominee to the chief appraiser within 45 days of notification by the Board of Directors;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that each taxing unit entitled to vote as provided by §6.03 of the Texas Tax Code shall be sent notice that there exists a vacancy on the Caldwell County Appraisal District Board of Directors.

Adopted by a majority vote this 13th day of December, 2016.

(k) The governing body of each taxing unit entitled to vote shall determine its vote by resolution and submit it to the chief appraiser before December 15. The chief appraiser shall count the votes, declare the five candidates who receive the largest cumulative vote totals elected, and submit the results before December 31 to the governing body of each taxing unit in the district and to the candidates. For purposes of determining the number of votes received by the candidates, the candidate receiving the most votes of the conservation and reclamation districts is considered to have received all of the votes cast by conservation and reclamation districts and the other candidates are considered not to have received any votes of the conservation and reclamation districts. The chief appraiser shall resolve a tie vote by any method of chance.

(l) If a vacancy occurs on the board of directors other than a vacancy in the position held by a county assessor-collector serving as a nonvoting director, each taxing unit that is entitled to vote by this section may nominate by resolution adopted by its governing body a candidate to fill the vacancy. The unit shall submit the dame of its nominee to the chief appraiser within 45 days after notification from the board of directors of the existence of the vacancy, and the chief appraiser shall prepare and deliver to the board of directors within the next five days a list of the nominees. The board of directors shall elect by majority vote of its members one of the nominees to fill the vacancy.

Provisions of Tex. Tax Code Ann. §§ 6.01, 6.03, 23.01, 25.21 expressly provide the necessary authority for an appraisal review board to ensure that the mineral interests of a county are appraised based on market value, unreduced by fraud, and for local taxing units to bring a challenge, if necessary, to insist that the appraisal review board do so. Therefore, the court issued a writ of mandamus directing a district court to vacate its order denying pleas to jurisdiction and to dismiss an action brought by local taxing units alleging that certain companies owning oil properties in the county committed fraud and conspiracy with respect to the valuation of the oil properties for ad valorem tax purposes. Under Tex. Const. art. V, § 8, the district court did not have subject matter jurisdiction because the legislature had provided that the claim had to be heard before the appraisal review board. In re ExxonMobil Corp., 153 S.W.3d 605, 2004 Tex. App. LEXIS 7811 (Tex. App. Amerillo 2004).

# Community Development Partnership Program (CDPP) Grants

Community and Economic Development



LCRA and its electric and water customers provide grants for community projects. LCRA's grant program helps local governments and nonprofit organizations fund capital improvement projects to benefit the public. These projects must be located within LCRA's service area.

## View the eligibility requirements

Volunteer fire departments, emergency medical services, school districts, libraries, civic groups, local governments and nonprofit organizations may apply for the grants.

Social service projects and limited use facilities – such as food pantries, transitional housing and substance abuse facilities – are not eligible for funding.

Emphasis will be placed on projects that include energy efficiency and water conservation, education, volunteer fire departments, and public safety organizations that have been impacted by wildfires and the extreme drought conditions.

Applicants requesting \$5,000 or more in grant funding must have at least 20 percent in matching funds. Applicants may request as much as \$50,000 from CDPP grants. Approved grant applicants may not always receive the level of funding requested.

CDPP grants are awarded twice a year.

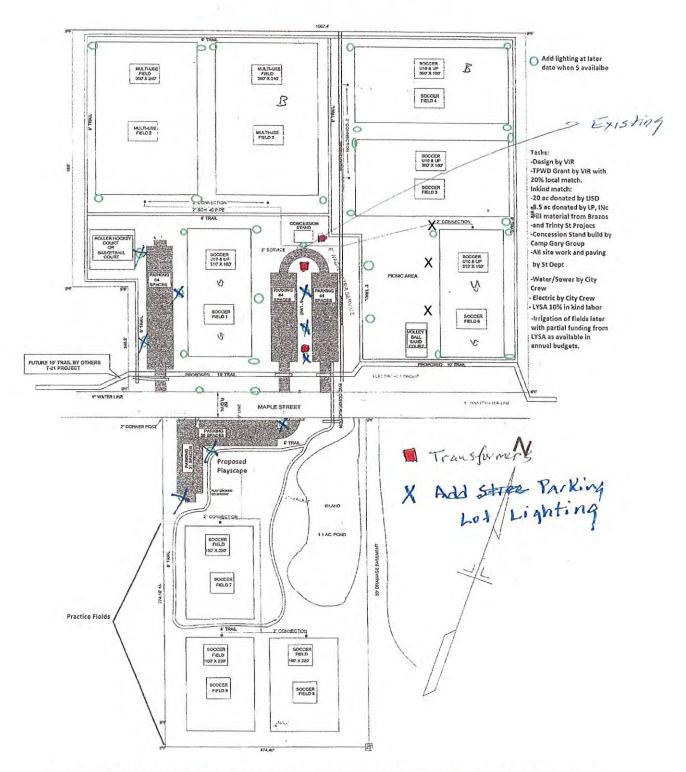

At least five members must currently be or have been flight rated, and two members may be appointed as at-large members. Members shall serve three-year terms, such terms coinciding with the council position making the appointment.  Sec. 4-28. Eligibility for board membership.  No person having a financial interest in any commercial carrier by air, or in any concession, right or privilege to conduct any business or render any service for compensation upon the premises of the Lockhart Municipal Airport shall be eligible for membership on the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board.  Sec. 4-32. Limitations of authority.  The Lockhart Municipal Airport Advisory Board shall not have authority to incur or create any debt in connection with airport operations; nor shall the board be empowered to enter into any contract, leases, or other legal obligations binding upon the City of Lockhart; nor shall the board have authority to hire airport personnel or direct airport personnel in the execution of their duties.
NOTES: CONSTRUCTIO N BOARD APPOINTMENTS	Section B101.4, Board Decision, is amended to read as follows:  The construction board of adjustments and appeals shall have the power, as further defined in Appendix B, to hear appeals of decisions and interpretations of the buildin official and consider variances of the technical codes; and to conduct hearings on determinations of the building official regarding unsafe or dangerous buildings, structure and/or service systems, and to issue orders in accordance with the procedures beginning with section 12-442 of this Code [of Ordinances].  Section B101.2, Membership of Board, is amended to read as follows:  Each District Council member and the Mayor shall appoint one member to the Construction Board of Appeals making it a five (5) member board and each Councilmember at Large shall appoint an alternate. The term of office of the board members shall be three (3) years, such terms coinciding with the council position making the appointment. The two (2) alternates shall also serve the term coinciding with the council position making the appointments. Vacancies shall be filled for an unexpired term in the manner in which the original appointments are required to be made. Board members shall consist of members who are qualified by experience and/or training to pass on matter pertaining to building construction and are not employees of the City of Lockhart.
NOTES: ELECTRIC BOARD APPOINTMENTS	Sec. 12-132. Members.  (a) Appointments to the examining and supervisory board of electricians and appeals shall conform to section 2-210 except that the board shall consist of five persons with one being appointed by each district council member and one by the mayor. Each member shall serve three-year terms with such terms to coincide with the council position making the appointment.  (b) Each board member shall reside within the county and such board shall include one member who shall be a building contractor; one layman; two members shall be master electricians who are currently licensed by the city; and one member shall be either a building contractor or master electrician licensed by the city. There shall be two ex-officio members, one who shall be the city electrical inspector, and one shall be the fire marshal.  Sec. 12-133. Officers and quorum.  The members of the examining and supervising board of electricians and appeals shall select a chairman and secretary. A quorum shall consist of three members.
NOTES: HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION	Sec. 28-3. Historical preservation commission.  (b) The commission shall consist of seven members, appointed by the city council in accordance with section 2-210, who shall whenever possible meet one or more of the following qualities:  (1) A registered architect, planner or representative of a design profession,  (2) A registered professional engineer in the State of Texas,  (3) A member of a nonprofit historical organization of Caldwell County,  (4) A local licensed real estate broker or member of the financial community,  (5) An owner of an historic landmark residential building,  (6) An owner or tenant of a business property that is an historic landmark or in an historic district,  (7) A member of the Caldwell County Historical Commission.
NOTES: PARKS ADVISORY BOARD	Sec. 40-133. Members.  (a) The board shall consist of seven members appointed in accordance with section 2-210 to serve three years terms, such terms to coincide with the council position making the appointment and two alternates shall also be appointed by the mayor and mayor pro-term, one each. The two alternates shall also serve the term coinciding with the council position making the appointments. #### Sec. 2-209. - Rules for appointment.

The city council hereby sets the following rules:

- (1) Except as may be established by existing city ordinances/resolutions the process for selecting members shall be open to all Lockhart citizens, who must apply for appointment, to include those applying for reappointment. Reappointment shall not be deemed automatic.
- (2) Council shall seek to appoint the most qualified or best persons available, while also respecting the need for diverse community opinions.
- (3) No member of any appointed body shall serve on more than one quasi-judicial or advisory board or commission.
- (4) No appointed body shall deviate from its charge, deliberate items not on its agendas, or speak for the council or City of Lockhart without council authorization.
- (5) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.
- (6) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County, to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.

#### Section 2-210. Method of selection; number of members; terms.

- (a) The mayor and city councilmembers shall nominate individuals to serve on boards and commissions. Each nomination shall then be confirmed by a simple majority of the entire city council.
- (b) Except as provided herein, there shall be seven members appointed to each board or commission corresponding with the seven members or places of the city council. Each city councilmember, except at provided herein, shall nominate a qualified person to serve in a place on an appointed body corresponding to their place on the council. At-large councilmembers shall be designated as places 5 and 6, and the mayor's position as place 7, for the purpose of this section. Nominations shall be made to fill vacant positions and/or positions whose terms have expired within 90 days of the event, such as a resignation or an election. Should any city councilmember fail to name an appointee to one of his/her corresponding places on any body within the above described 90 days, another councilmember shall then have the privilege to nominate a person to fill that same position, as described in subsection (a). However, once that position becomes vacant again for any reason, the appointment shall revert to the place corresponding with the original city council seat/place number for nominations.
- (c) Beginning with the election in May, 1998, the council shall nominate and confirm four members to serve in places 1, 2, 5, 6 on each board and commission in accordance with subsections (a) and (b) above, and with the standards set in Ordinance Number 97-09, Governance Policies. With the election of May, 1999, the remaining three places shall be filled following the same procedure as above.
- (d)Terms of service on appointed bodies shall be the same three-year terms as the councilmember who nominates a person to serve. However, a person may be appointed to complete the unexpired term of a vacant position, due to a resignation, for example.
- (e) When a person has completed a term, or terms, of service and will be vacating a place, that person may continue to serve until a replacement is nominated and confirmed by the city council.
- (f) At the discretion of the majority of the city council, one Caldwell County resident who is also an owner of real property within any local historic district may be appointed as a full member to the historical preservation commission.
- (g) Exceptions to the above regulations shall be all volunteer/special purpose/ad hoc committees appointed from time to time by the city council and the zoning board of adjustments, whose members shall serve two-year terms in accordance with V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.008. All other provisions of this section, and ordinance number 97-09 which do not conflict with the chapters establishing these bodies shall be applicable.

#### Sec. 2-212. Removal and resignation of members.

- (a) All board, commission and committee members serve at the pleasure of the city council and may be removed from office with or without cause at the discretion of the city council.
- (b) Board, commission and committee members may resign from office at any time by filing a written resignation, dated and signed by the member, with the City Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the City Secretary without further action by the city council. If the city council appoints a new member to replace the resigned member, the new member shall be appointed to serve out the remainder of the resigned member's term.

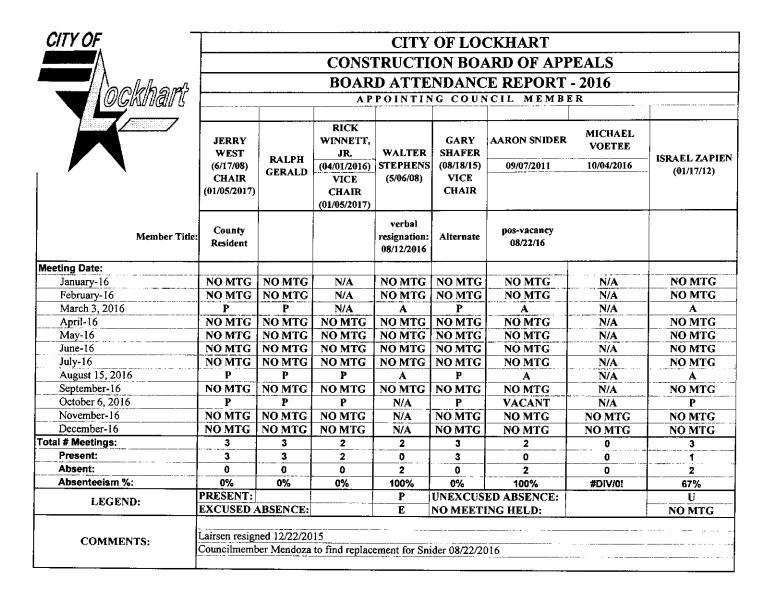
