The applicant proposes to purchase the subject property and use the existing buildings primarily for warehouse and wholesale distribution purposes, although there may also be an office and/or small retail component. If the zoning change is approved, the proposed CHB classification would allow "warehousing for local sales and distribution", which is the only use listed in any commercial district that allows warehousing other than self-storage warehouses. However, the proposed use may or may not fall within that description, depending on the definition of "local". ORDINANCE 2016-29

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, TO RECLASSIFY THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS LOTS 1 AND 6, BLOCK 10, ORIGINAL TOWN OF LOCKHART, CONSISTING OF 0.531 ACRE LOCATED AT 319 SOUTH CHURCH STREET, FROM CMB COMMERCIAL MEDIUM BUSINESS DISTRICT TO CHB COMMERCIAL HEAVY BUSINESS DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, on November 30, 2016, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing and failed to recommend approval or denial with a 2-2 tie vote and one abstention; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend the zoning map as provided in Section 64-128 of the Code of Ordinances; and,


WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in conformance with applicable law;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOCKHART, TEXAS, THAT:

- 1. The above-referenced property described in Zoning Change request ZC-16-08 as Lots 1 and 6, Block 10, Original Town of Lockhart, consisting of 0.531 acre located at 319 South Church Street, will be reclassified from CMB Commercial Medium Business District to CHB Commercial Heavy Business District.
- II. Severability: If any provision, section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforced, the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or its application shall not be affected, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting and of the Mayor in approving this ordinance that no portion, provision, or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by way of reasons of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion, provision or regulation.
- III. Repealer: That all other ordinances, sections, or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the City of Lockhart in conflict with the provisions set out above in this ordinance are hereby repealed or amended as indicated.
- IV. Publication: That the City Secretary is directed to cause this ordinance caption to be published in a newspaper of general circulation according to law.
- V. Effective Date: That this ordinance shall become effective and be in full force immediately upon and from the date of its passage.

BACKGROUND DATA

SIZE OF PROPERTY: 0.53 acre

EXISTING USE OF PROPERTY: Two buildings used for storage LAND USE PLAN DESIGNATION: Mixed retail, office, residential

ANALYSIS OF ISSUES

REASON FOR REQUESTED CHANGE: The applicant proposes to purchase the subject property and use the existing buildings primarily for warehouse and wholesale distribution purposes, although there may also be an office and/or small retail component. If the zoning change is approved, the proposed CHB classification would allow "warehousing for local sales and distribution", which is the only use listed in any commercial district that allows warehousing other than self-storage warehouses. However, the proposed use may or may not fall within that description, depending on the definition of "local".

AREA CHARACTERISTICS:

TRANSITION OF ZONING DISTRICTS: CHB is just one step more intense that the existing CMB zoning, although if the rezoning is approved the subject property would be a one-parcel island of CHB, which allows more uses that may not be compatible with existing nearby uses. The nearest CHB zoning is the HEB property two blocks east. CHB increases the potential for incompatibility with uses allowed in the residential zoning that is south and west of the subject property.

ADEQUACY OF INFRASTRUCTURE: Street access is currently from Brazos Street, and adequate utilities already serve the site.


POTENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD IMPACT: The proposed use would be similar to the existing storage use of the property, but could involve more frequent truck traffic and loading/unloading activity. Regardless of whether or not it would create a negative impact, the proposed CHB classification would remain if and when that use is terminated or changed to something else by either the applicant or a new owner in the future. The CHB district does allow more uses by-right than the CMB district, including most specific uses listed in the CMB district plus several additional uses of potentially higher intensity. The attached table contains examples of differences between the CMB and CHB districts in terms of uses that are allowed by-right or as a specific use. Some of the uses allowed in the CHB district might not be considered appropriate in a location that is a transition area from a primarily central business or medium commercial area to a residential neighborhood. The table does not show uses that are allowed the same in both the CMB and CHB districts such as offices, retail, restaurants, etc.

CONSISTENCY WITH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN: The requested CHB zoning classification is not entirely consistent with the Lockhart 2020 Future Land Use map designation of Mixed Retail, Office, and Residential for the property. The current CMB zoning is not entirely consistent, either, but because it is more limited than the CHB district it is considered less of a deviation. The Mixed Retail, Office, and Residential land use designation was intended to match up with the CCB Commercial Central Business zoning classification. An excerpt of the future land use map for this area is attached.

ALTERNATIVE CLASSIFICATIONS: Either the current CMB zoning or the CCB zoning classification are better alternatives than the proposed CHB zoning of the property, but they would not allow the proposed use.

RESPONSE TO NOTIFICATION: Public hearing notices were mailed to 15 owners of property within 200 feet of the subject property. There have been several responses from citizens who either received public hearing notices or saw the signs posted on the property. Their major concern seems to be the higher intensity uses that would be allowed on the site by the proposed CHB zoning classification. As of the date of this report, seven written protests (attached) have been received. Two of the letters are from citizens who spoke in opposition at the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION ACTION: There were two members absent from the Commission at the time of the vote on this Item, and one member abstained from participating due to a potential perceived conflict of interest. A motion to recommend denial died for lack of a second. With four members voting, a substitute motion and second to recommend approval resulted in a 2-2 tie vote. Therefore, there is essentially no recommendation for approval or for denial from the Commission,



This letter is to express my opposition to a proposed zoning change being made by Conley Covert for a zoning change from CMB Commercial Medium Business District to CH8 Commercial Heavy Business District on Lots 1 and 6, Block 10, Original Town of Lockhart located at 319 South Church Street,

I own property on Church street directly in front of the proposed zoning change. My opposition to this zoning is based on the following points:

- A heavy commercial use in primarily a residential area is out of character with the surrounding land uses. The property is surrounded by residences and churches.
- The property has been largely vacant and unused for over the past twenty-five years. As a
 result, any development of the property is going to have a profound negative impact on
 surrounding land uses.
- The proposed zoning change has the potential to devalue our property values.
- Although I am zoned commercial, we have made a sincere effort to respect and not be intrusive
 with the surrounding residential land uses.
- Other concern is the uncontrolled freight truck traffic that occasionally uses Live Oak Street is
 damaging our 300-year Oak tree from the tractor trailers that follow no height restrictions. This

RE: ZC-16-08: Requested Zoning Change from CMB Commercial Medium Business District to CHB Commercial Heavy Business District on lots 1 and 6, Block 10, Original Town of Lockhart located at 319 South Church Street

Please let this letter serve as my opposition to the zoning change request to Commercial Heavy Business (CHB) District from Commercial Medium Business (CMB) District. I own the residence located at 402 South Church Street which is located within two hundred feet of the property located at 319 South Church Street. My inquiry about the proposed business(es) that are going to be conducted on the property requiring such a zoning change have netted no real definitive business plan, building plan(s), site or demolition plan(s) since those would only be filed when an owner applies for a building permit.

The fact that this location has not sold and the current owner is asking for re-zoning to be attractive to a potential buyer scares me. Should their deal not go through we are stuck with a new CHB Zone that is open to any type of business that fits the definition. There is no guarantee that this property is going to sell to the proposed buyer or that the proposed business will be the only use for this property. I fear any businesses that might want to locate on the property will bring with them heavy traffic, noise pollution, constant waste requiring trucks in and out, waste materials that don't really fit in a residential neighborhood, nighttime activity, people coming and going for all hours; basically all of the normal activities that one would associate with business endeavors needing to locate in a CHB District. These businesses will adversely affect the pristine quality of the quiet small town neighborhood feel that exists now.

I see this zoning change as only benefiting the two parties that are tossing around ideas at this point. Further, it is my understanding that it is not uncommon for realtors to get properties rezoned so that they may make a one-time profit and off they go without concern for what that new zoning does to the surrounding area for time thereafter.

Lockhart Planning and Zoning has done a considerable effort through the years to develop proper industrial zones to attract such businesses that require CHB zoning. These districts are in close proximity to all of Lockhart and the surrounding area to make them desirable to businesses that produce products

and services for distribution to local and central Texas markets. The current industrial zones are not at capacity and are strategically located away from residential neighborhoods so that they don't present the nightmarish atmosphere that I mentioned above. I see no need to re-zone a half-block of our unique downtown area so close to our Historic District and the surrounding residential neighborhood that makes Lockhart the unique antique in Central Texas towns.

I am not in opposition to growth in Lockhart and bringing in new business is essential to that growth. I am in opposition of making Lockhart into an ill planned cobbled up mess that does little to attract tourism and retail trade by not planning effective entry into the heart of our town.

Thank you for your consideration of my protest to the zoning change. I do care about our beautiful town and I do want to attract tourism and trade, but at what cost? I don't want to give up my quality life on my little corner of paradise. I don't want that for my neighbors either. I think the City has been working on a great Master Plan to bring Lockhart to life while maintaining its unique small town values. Locating heavy business so close to our Historic District and downtown neighbors is a mistake that might not be able to be rectified.

I appreciate the opportunity to address the Planning and Zoning Commission. In reviewing the Lockhart Code of Ordinances, I see that the goals include providing for the integrity of residential neighborhoods.

I understand that the proposed zoning change at 319 South Church Street, which abuts Blanco Street, less than a block from my residence, is to allow for wholesale distribution of food products. I have a number of concerns, which include the following:

- 1. A greater use of trucks and a change in the nature of the trucks, will greatly increase the noise, interfering with quiet enjoyment of nearby residential property and the integrity of the residential neighborhood. Mine would not be the only residence affected. There are private residences across the street as well as on the same block as 319 South Church Street. This is not an insignificant fear. The peace and quiet of the residential zones is one of Lockhart's most valuable assets. The current grandfathered business that involved storing construction equipment and materials did not incur unusual noise, since the trucks were mostly the sort of pickup trucks thet many ordinary Lockhart residents drive and the activity was limited in scale.
- 2. Also, 319 South Church Street is located near two local churches which receive significant personal vehicle traffic on Sundays, Wednasdays, and even other days of the week, depending on church activities. Adding regular truck loading, unloading, arrivals and departures will increase the danger and risk of vehicle accidents. That area also lies along regular school bus routes, presenting edditional risks and dangers for the children that ride these school buses. There is also a fair amount of pedestrian and bicycle traffic along Live Oak Street, as residents walk and bike to and from the library and the local H.E.B.
- 3. Of even greater concern is the aquaduct system, almost a small bayou, which runs down the center of the block in question. This waterway runs into creek in the park; stickers all around the nearby drains warn against illegal dumping of chemicals or liquids. It seems contradictory to allow heavy commercial usage of half of that particular block with such an environmentally sensitive area, and I cannot how the zoning could be changed without consulting the Plum Creek Watershed Partnership, Plum Creek Conservation District, Caldwell County Regional Water and Wastewater planning groups, EPA Region 6, TCEQ, or other regulatory agencies.

- 4. The streets in the area and the paving of the waterway in the Baptist church parking lot on the same block have both suffered damage by the heavy equipment used in recent film production; like many residents in the area, I experienced some inconvenience and noise, especially during latest HBO production. I am not objecting to film production at all since it is temporary and so financielly lucrative for the Lockhart economy, but streets and aqueduct curbs are not suited for continual usage of heavy equipment or heavy trucks, and I note that even temporary use created some damage, particularly along Live Oak street.
- 5. Whatever the acquiring company's intentions for use, once zoned for Heavy Commercial Business, the Church Street property could be sold forward and be put to other uses such as commercial processing/printing/laboratory/research facilities, hotel/motel, farm machinery and heavy equipment sales/service/rental/storage, or other industrial purposes that would be even less congenial so near residences and churches.
- 6. Finally, the Church Street property cannot be the only site available for such a food distribution operation. There are plentiful sites, including open commercial space with more perking, and Lockhart even provides several industrial parks for businesses that need distribution portals. Also, this should not pose a hardship for the current owner, given that the growth of Austin is now reaching into Lockhart. Indeed, when I first saw the zoning notification, I assumed that the zoning requested would be an increase in development or activity, perhaps for multifamily use, but still congenial to a residential area.

Given these considerations, I request the Zoning and Planning Commission reject the request for rezoning of 319 South Church Street to Commercial Heavy Business District.

MISSION STATEMENT OF THE CALDWELL COUNTY MUSEUM

The mission of the Caldwell County Museum is to promote the historical heritage of Caldwell County.

The museum will collect, identify, and preserve historical material pertaining to Caldwell County and its residents. The museum collection will consist of the historical jail artifacts, photographs, books, documents and maps.

The museum will educate the public, residents and visitors, children and adults, through interpretive exhibits, programs and special events.

HOTEL/MOTEL TAX DISTRIBUTION REQUEST FOR 2016

In 2016, the Caldwell County Museum received a total of \$1400.93 from the hotel/motel tax distribution. The entire amount was used for the docent salary for the museum.

For 2017, we respectfully request \$4840 from the hotel/motel tax distribution. This amount would allow us to increase the hours of operation and our programming. We are always willing to pair with area wide museums to consider exchange of material. If the docent was on site longer, the presentations could receive more intensive care.

We interact with a large variety of groups throughout the year. Many of the activities are done by volunteers after posted hours of operations. Over the past year, we have conducted several tours for elementary school classes, Boy Scout units, and Chamber of Commerce bus tours. As always, we try to accommodate requests for the museum from film groups and paranormal groups who continue to inquire about the presence of ghosts.

In October, for our 13th year, we sponsored our popular and successful historical cemetery tour entitled "Speaking of the Dead: Night Ramblings in a Texas Graveyard." The city has always been so helpful in the care of the cemetery and our program sells out each year; this year was no exception. We look forward to continuing our working relationship with the city in taking care of the grounds around the museum.

On weekends, when the Chamber of Commerce is closed, we support the Chamber by providing information to tonrists who are visiting Lockhart.

The museum is scheduled to be open on Saturdays and Sundays from 1-5pm. We are able to accommodate special requests for tours during the week. We have continued to be featured on KLRU's "Day Tripper" show, and every time they run the program, we get a great response in increased visitors. Our history is one of our greatest assets, and the jail museum stands tall as a focal point for us all.

In 2016, we had a total of 1762 museum visitors. Of this total, 1411 were from out of town. This indicates that 80% of our visitors were from somewhere other than Lockhart.

On behalf of the Caldwell County Museum, I would like to that you for your foresight in the past, and we hope that you will continue your support this year of a great tourist destination that benefits the entire community.

The popularity of the car culture in Austin is growing, and one of the clearest examples of that is the attendance at numerous Austin annual car shows that have been running for less than a decade.

The recent Hot Rods and Hatters show that infiltrates the downtown area of Lockhart, combining a love of motors and music, is a prime example. The event just wrapped up its fifth year, and the response was more than even the organizers expected.

As it stood, the plan was to block off 18 city blocks to make way for the cars that were expected.

"We exceeded our street closures and ended up with over 22 city blocks of Hot Rods," said organizer Joel Gammage, adding that the final tally for the event was 836 cars and over 30,000 spectators.

Also in its fifth year is the annual Georgetown Airport Classic Car and Vintage Airplane show, which is running today in Georgetown.

Organizer Stephanie Myers began the tradition after putting in volunteer worfor a show that fell through in downtow Austin

Like Gammage, Myers combined the car theme with another popular pustin aviation (specifically vintage aircraft, which complement classic cars), and developed a loyal following.

In its first incarnation, Myers recall that there were less than 500 people total coming to see the show. Last year's event drew over 270 cars, and upwards of 5,000 spectators showed up as well.

The numbers aren't in for this year's Georgetown show, but the number of aircraft making plans to attend had dos bled last year's numbers well before the event.

In addition to these well-attended events, there are numerous other local shows, many of them charitable fundraising events only in their first year or two, and are also reporting steady growth in attendance.

Mayor White opened the work session and advised the Council, staff and the audience that staff would provide information and explanations about the following items:

A. DISCUSS MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 1, 2016.

Mayor White requested corrections to the minutes. There were none.

B. DISCUSS FUEL BID AWARD TO SCHMIDT & SONS, INC. OF LOCKHART WITH A PROFIT MARGIN OF 4 CENTS PER GALLON FOR GASOLINE AND 5 CENTS PER GALLON FOR DIESEL OVER THE OIL PRICE INFORMATION SERVICES (OPIS) PRICE FROM AUSTIN, TEXAS, RACK, POSTED WEEKLY, AND APPOINTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN **APPROVED DOCUMENTS. [FORM 1295=2016-11-22-20]**

Mr. Rodgers stated that fuel bids were sought in compliance with State law. The City uses about 40,000 gallons of gasoline and 26,000 gallons of diesel per year. Bids were received from Johnson Oil of Gonzales, Texas, Southwestern Counties Oil Company of Camarillo, California, Gold Star Petroleum, Inc. of Spring, Texas, and Schmidt & Sons, Inc., of Lockhart, Texas. The overall best bid was submitted by Gold Star Petroleum, Inc. of Spring, Texas, at \$0.0396 per gallon for gasoline and \$0.0496 per gallon for diesel, but company bid on a daily OPIS which does not comply with the required specifications. Since local companies are also allowed an additional 5% consideration in their bid submittals, staff recommends that Schmidt & Sons, Inc. of Lockhart, Texas be awarded the bid at \$0.04 per gallon for gasoline and \$0.050 per gallon for diesel. Besides being a local company, Schmidt & Sons have a long history of timely deliveries when the fuel is needed by the City. The company also provides 24 hour emergency fuel supplies from their facility on Patton Road when the City fuel systems are down due to maintenance or repairs. There was discussion.

C. DISCUSS STAFF'S PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE FREE ADOPTIONS, RABIES SHOTS, AND SPAY/NEUTER SERVICES IN THE INTEREST OF A PUBLIC PURPOSE FOR ANIMALS IN THE SHELTER ADOPTED BEGINNING NOVEMBER 23, 2016 THROUGH JANUARY 31, 2017, USING DONATED FUNDS AND SAVINGS IN DOG FOOD COSTS.

Mr. Rodgers stated that there are sufficient donated funds to provide these services for animals in the shelter beginning November 23, 2016 through January 31, 2017. This would be done in the interest of a public purpose. This has been done for the last two years with some success. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

D. DISCUSS REGIONAL WASTEWATER TREATMENT CONTRACT WITH THE GUADALUPE-BLANCO RIVER AUTHORITY (GBRA) TO CONTINUE OPERATIONS AND MANAGEMENT OF LOCKHART'S TWO WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS, AND APPOINTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE CONTRACT IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that Lockhart has an agreement with GBRA to operate and manage Lockhart's two wastewater treatment plants. The current agreement expires February 1, 2017. The new proposed contract agreement was reviewed by the City Manager and the City Attorney; appropriate revisions were made to the document and agreed to by GBRA's attorney. GBRA has performed commendably in the operations and management of both the Larremore and Blackjack Wastewater Treatment Plants. The proposed contract will expire August 31, 2027, or a date when any existing bond payments financed through GBRA would be paid in full. An automatic renewal provision is in the contract contingent upon either party providing appropriate notice. The City has the right to terminate the agreement with a year's notice. A provision in the agreement allows GBRA to expand its use of the plants and the City's system to other users but only with the approval of the Lockhart City Council. The total average use capacity at both plants is currently 50%. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

E. DISCUSS WHOLESALE METERING SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH THE LOWER COLORADO RIVER AUTHORITY (LCRA) TO COLLECT WHOLESALE METERING DATA AT THE BLACKJACK SUBSTATION AND AT THE NEW CLEAR FORK ELECTRIC SUBSTATION ON MAPLE STREET, AND APPOINTING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that the purpose of this agreement is to contract with LCRA to capture data by metering all the points of wholesale electric power delivered at the electric substations from which Lockhart receives its power. The metering and record keeping are required by comply with ERCOT and other federal agency requirements. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

F. DISCUSS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH CALDWELL COUNTY FOR STORAGE OF COUNTY RESCUE BOAT AND ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT/ACCESSORIES AT 214 BUFKIN LANE, AND APPOINTING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that Caldwell County Emergency Operations needs a place to store a swift water rescue boat and its associated equipment. The storage place needs to be centrally located in the County. Sufficient storage space is available at 214 Bufkin Lane. The boat would also be available for Lockhart Fire Fighters to use when needed. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

G. DISCUSS THE CITY OF LOCKHART EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WITH ASSISTANCE FROM THE LOCKHART FIRE DEPARTMENT ENTERING INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE SERVICES WITH THE LOCKHART SECURE WORK PROGRAM FACILITY (MTC), AND APPOINTING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN THE DOCUMENT IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that MTC is requesting the City of Lockhart EMS to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement for emergency medical care services with assistance from the Lockhart Fire Department during any disaster/mass care incidents for response to their Lockhart Facility with certain assurances and conditions as specified in the agreement. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

H. DISCUSS MUTUAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF LOCKHART FIRE DEPARTMENT AND THE MTC LOCKHART CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, A PRIVATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY CONTRACTING WITH THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE TO PROVIDE PRISON FACILITIES AND SERVICES IN CALDWELL COUNTY, TO FACILITATE FIRE DRILLS, AND OTHER PUBLIC SAFETY EXERCISES IN THE INTEREST OF PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, SECURITY, WELFARE, AND PEACE, AND APPOINTING THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT IF APPROVED.

Mr. Rodgers stated that the agreement will provide the mechanism and basis for public safety exercises and mock drills with the Lockhart Fire Department and MTC personnel in the interest of public safety. Mr. Rodgers recommended approval. There was discussion.

RECESS: Mayor White announced that the Council would recess for a break at 6:45 p.m.

- 4H: Approve Mutual Assistance Agreement between the City of Lockhart Fire Department and the MTC Lockhart Correctional Facility, a private correctional facility contracting with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice to provide prison facilities and services in Caldwell County, to facilitate fire drills, and other public safety exercises in the interest of public health, safety, security, welfare, and peace, and appointing the City Manager to sign the agreement if approved.

At least five members must currently be or hav been flight rated, and two members may be appointed as at-large members. Members shall serve three-year terms, such terms coinciding with the council position making the appointment. Sec. 4-28. Eligibility for board membership. No person having a financial interest in any commercial carrier by air, or in any concession, right or privilege to conduct any business or render any service for compensation upon the premises of the Lockhart Municipal Airport shall be eligible for membership on the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board. Sec. 4-32. Limitations of authority. The Lockhart Municipal Airport Advisory Board shall not have authority to incur or create any debt in connection with airport operations; nor shall the board be empowered to enter into any contract, leases, or other legal obligations binding upon the City of Lockhart; nor shall the board have authority to hire airport personnel or direct airport personnel in the execution of their duties.

NOTES: ELECTRIC BOARD APPOINTMENTS	Sec. 12-132. Members. (a) Appointments to the examining and supervisory board of electricians and appeals shall conform to section 2-210 except that the board shall consist of five persons with one being appointed by each district council member and one by the mayor. Each member shall serve three-year terms with such terms to coincide with the council position making the appointment. (b) Each board member shall reside within the county and such board shall include one member who shall be a building contractor; one layman; two members shall be master electricians who are currently licensed by the city; and one member shall be either a building contractor or master electrician licensed by the city. There shall be two ex-officion members, one who shall be the city electrical inspector, and one shall be the fire marshal. Sec. 12-133. Officers and quorum. The members of the examining and supervising board of electricians and appeals shall select a chairman and secretary. A quorum shall consist of three members.
NOTES: HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION	Sec. 28-3. Historical preservation commission. (b) The commission shall consist of seven members, appointed by the city council in accordance with section 2-210, who shall whenever possible meet one or more of the following qualities: (1) A registered architect, planner or representative of a design profession, (2) A registered professional engineer in the State of Texas, (3) A member of a nonprofit historical organization of Caldwell County, (4) A local licensed real estate broker or member of the financial community, (5) An owner of an historic landmark residential building, (6) An owner or tenant of a business property that is an historic landmark or in an historic district, (7) A member of the Caldwell County Historical Commission.
NOTES: PARKS ADVISORY BOARD	Sec. 40-133. Members. Sec. 2-209. - Rules for appointment.

The city council hereby sets the following rules:

- (1) Except as may be established by existing city ordinances/resolutions the process for selecting members shall be open to all Lockhart citizens, who must apply for appointment, to include those applying for reappointment. Reappointment shall not be deemed automatic.
- (2) Council shall seek to appoint the most qualified or best persons available, while also respecting the need for diverse community opinions.
- (3) No member of any appointed body shall serve on more than one quasi-judicial or advisory board or commission.
- (4) No appointed body shall deviate from its charge, deliberate items not on its agendas, or speak for the council or City of Lockhart without council authorization.
- (5) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.
- (6) Subject to other qualifications as specifically required for membership on the below boards and commissions, the city council shall have the right (but not the duty) to appoint up to two members who are not Lockhart citizens but who are residents of Caldwell County, to the Lockhart Airport Advisory Board, the Eugene Clark Library Board, and the construction board of appeals.

Section 2-210. Method of selection; number of members; terms.

- (a) The mayor and city councilmembers shall nominate individuals to serve on boards and commissions. Each nomination shall then be confirmed by a simple majority of the entire city council.
- (b) Except as provided herein, there shall be seven members appointed to each board or commission corresponding with the seven members or places of the city council. Each city councilmember, except at provided herein, shall nominate a qualified person to serve in a place on an appointed body corresponding to their place on the council. At-large councilmembers shall be designated as places 5 and 6, and the mayor's position as place 7, for the purpose of this section. Nominations shall be made to fill vacant positions and/or positions whose terms have expired within 90 days of the event, such as a resignation or an election. Should any city councilmember fail to name an appointee to one of his/her corresponding places on any body within the above described 90 days, another councilmember shall then have the privilege to nominate a person to fill that same position, as described in subsection (a). However, once that position becomes vacant again for any reason, the appointment shall revert to the place corresponding with the original city council seat/place number for nominations.
- (c) Beginning with the election in May, 1998, the council shall nominate and confirm four members to serve in places 1, 2, 5, 6 on each board and commission in accordance with subsections (a) and (b) above, and with the standards set in Ordinance Number 97-09, Governance Policies. With the election of May, 1999, the remaining three places shall be filled following the same procedure as above.
- (d)Terms of service on appointed bodies shall be the same three-year terms as the councilmember who nominates a person to serve. However, a person may be appointed to complete the unexpired term of a vacant position, due to a resignation, for example.
- (e) When a person has completed a term, or terms, of service and will be vacating a place, that person may continue to serve until a replacement is nominated and confirmed by the city council.
- (f) At the discretion of the majority of the city council, one Caldwell County resident who is also an owner of real property within any local historic district may be appointed as a full member to the historical preservation commission.
- (g) Exceptions to the above regulations shall be all volunteer/special purpose/ad hoc committees appointed from time to time by the city council and the zoning board of adjustments, whose members shall serve two-year terms in accordance with V.T.C.A., Local Government Code § 211.008. All other provisions of this section, and ordinance number 97-09 which do not conflict with the chapters establishing these bodies shall be applicable.

Sec. 2-212. Removal and resignation of members.

- (a) All board, commission and committee members serve at the pleasure of the city council and may be removed from office with or without cause at the discretion of the city council.
- (b) Board, commission and committee members may resign from office at any time by filing a written resignation, dated and signed by the member, with the City Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the City Secretary without further action by the city council. If the city council appoints a new member to replace the resigned member, the new member shall be appointed to serve out the remainder of the resigned member's term.
