



Goal: Turnout in 1 Minute and 20 Seconds or Less for 90% of Emergency Incidents








PUBLIC ASSISTANCE, PUBLIC RELATIONS & PUBLIC EDUCATION











January 14th – Lockhart Fire responded to an approximately 50-acre wildland fire in the area of State Park Rd. and Patton Road. Several surrounding agencies responded to assist. No structures were lost due to the fire.



January 26th – Lockhart Fire participated in a full-scale exercise involving the 6th Civil Support Weapons of Mass Destruction Team out of Camp Mabry. The team is composed of U.S. Air Force and Army personnel. The team responds to potential chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear incidents when requested by the State. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), US Army North, and local first responders also participated. The exercise began in Dale and had a secondary response in Lockhart. Lockhart Fire, Lockhart EMS, Caldwell County Emergency Management, and Caldwell County Sheriff participated in the Lockhart portion of the exercise to support the operations of the team. The scenario in Lockhart involved an unknown substance release in a vehicle.



February 11th thru 19th – The State of Texas experienced some of the coldest weather on record for this time frame. The temperature remained below freezing for several days, with extended power outages, water outage, and icy road conditions. The City received water from FEMA to provide to citizens.



March 1^{st} – Annual fire hose service test. All in-service fire hose must be tested annually. Fire department tested over 8,000 feet of fire hose.





March 15th – All firefighters were fit tested for their SCBA mask.



March 23rd – Attended the Career and Technical Education (CTE) program at Lockhart High School. Lockhart Fire's A shift demonstrated their fire equipment and spoke to students about potential career in the fire service. The Fire Chief also serves on the programs committee.



March 27^{th} – A firefighter civil service entrance exam and physical agility test was completed. There were seven applicants who took the written test, and all passed the PAT at the high school.
