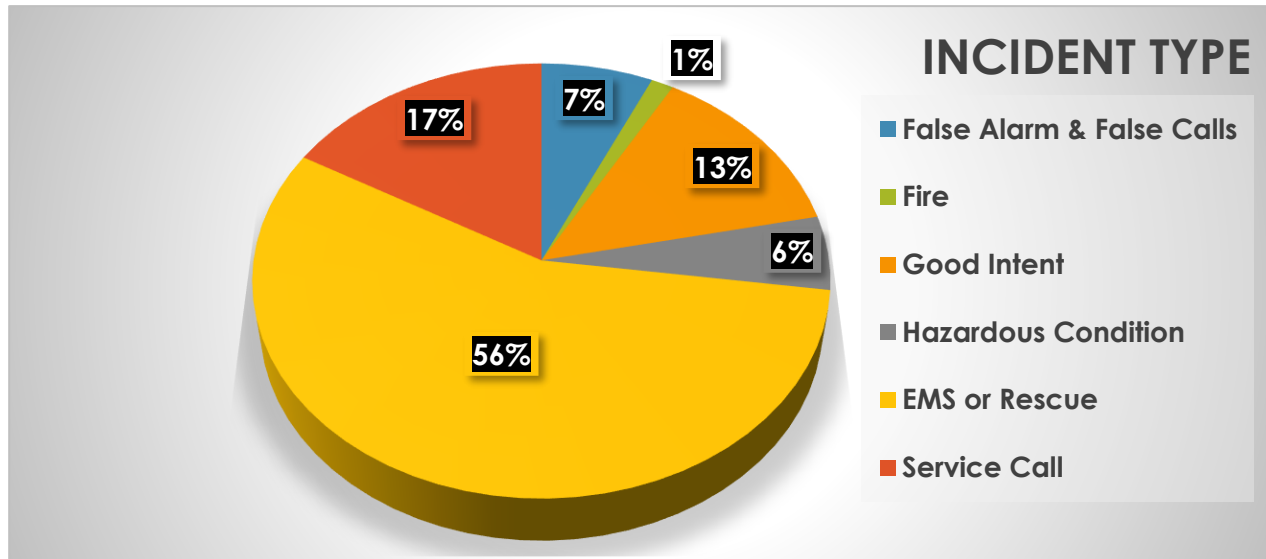

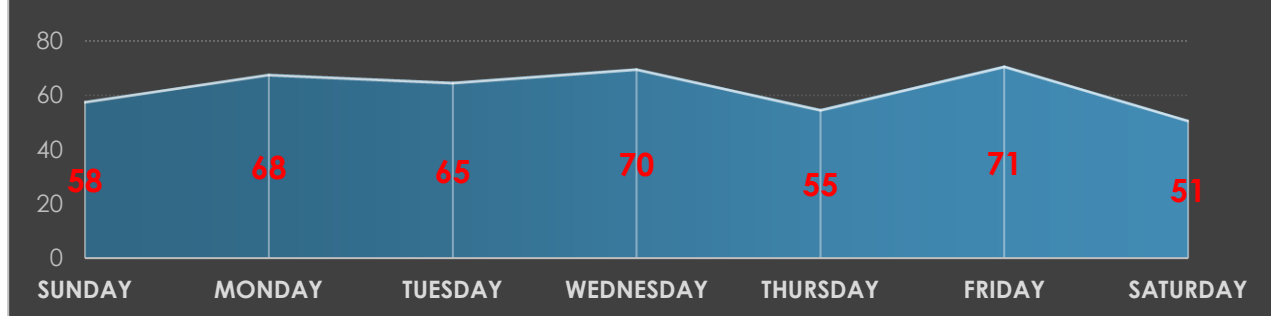
MISSION

The mission of Lockhart Fire Rescue is to serve and protect citizens of our community by providing the highest quality emergency response, community risk reduction, health care, and public safety education

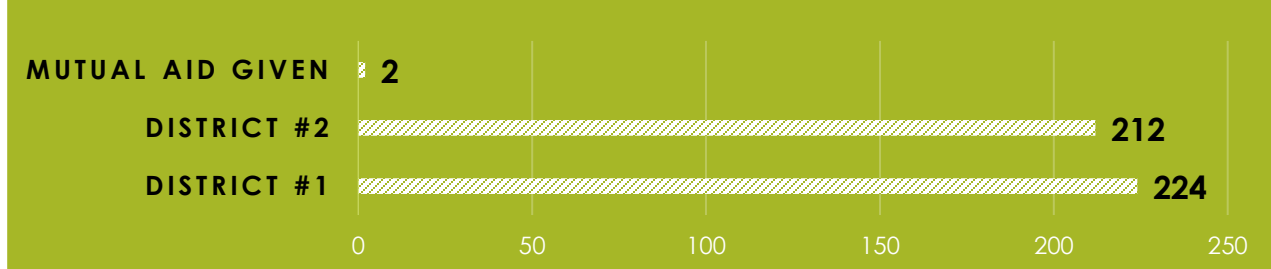
TOTAL INCIDENTS - 438

INCIDENTS BY DISTRICT

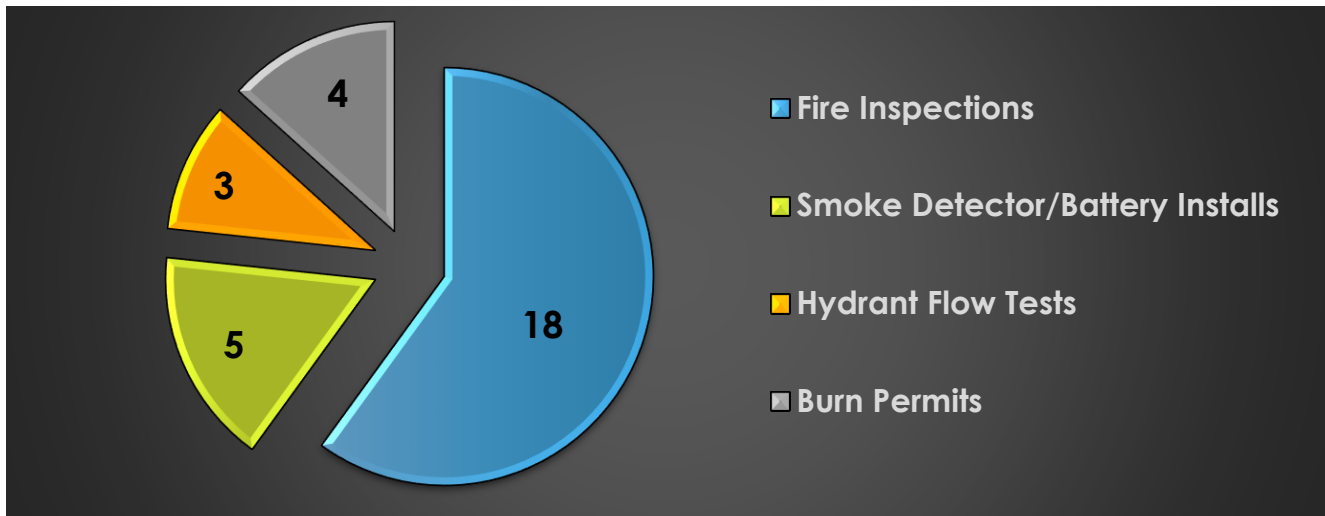

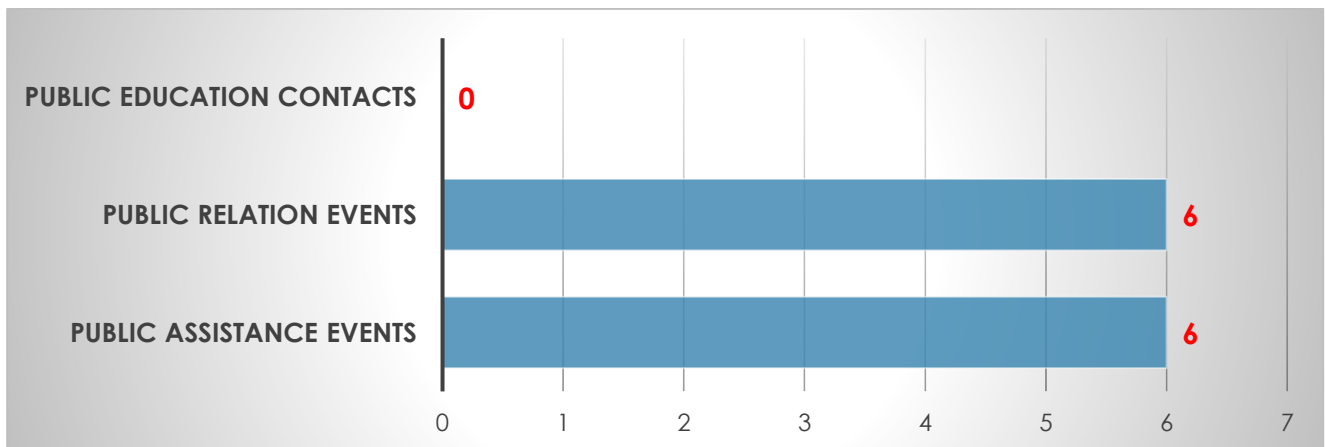

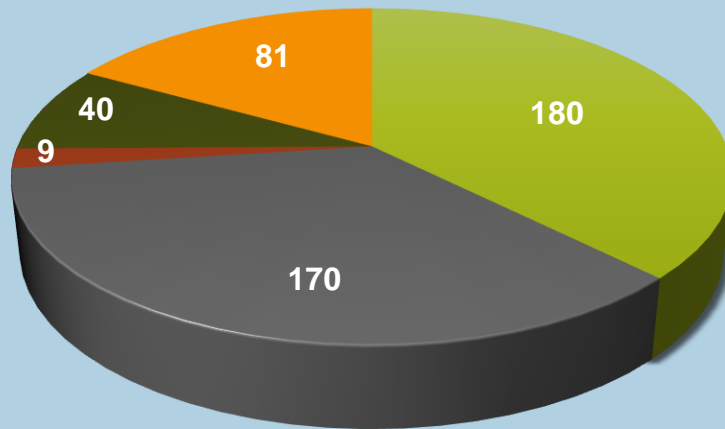

January 2nd & 3rd – Lockhart Fire Rescue received initial training on the new 75' Spartan Aerial apparatus purchased through Metro Fire Specialist, Inc. The purchase price of the aerial apparatus was \$1,229,670. Quint 2 will be housed at Fire Station #2. A Quint apparatus has five tools to carry out firefighting functions; a water pump, water tank, fire hose, aerial ladder, and ground ladders.



February 8th – Lockhart Fire Rescue held a civil service written exam and a physical ability test (PAT) to establish an eligibility list. Five applicants tested and four applicants passed the written and PAT portions.



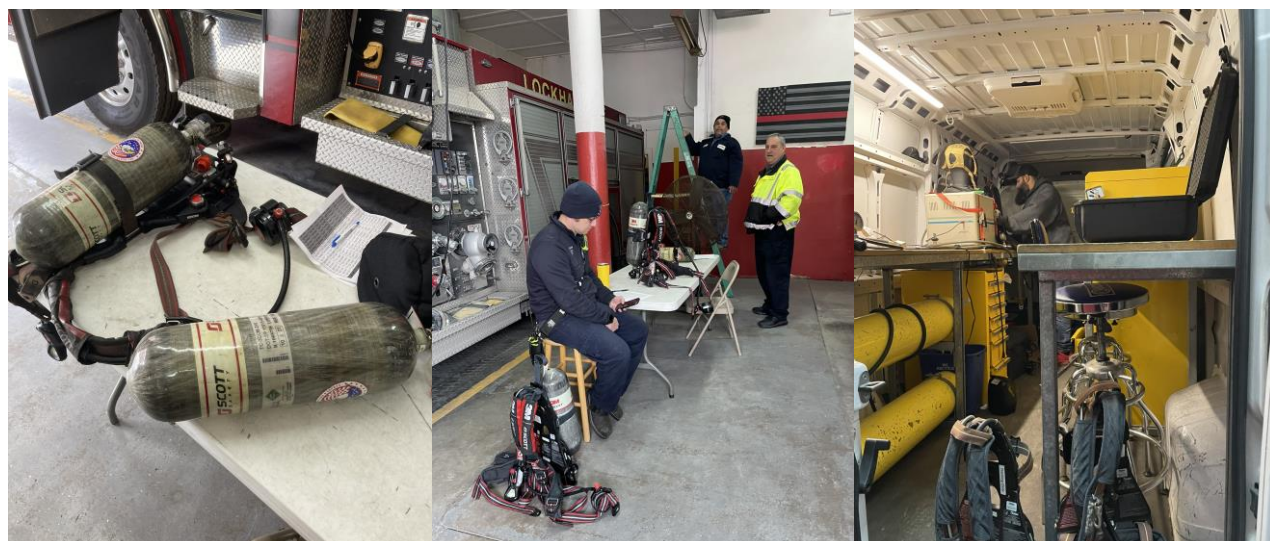

February 10th-14th – Lockhart Fire personnel performed the semi-annual required cleaning of structural protective ensembles including helmets, hoods, coats, gloves, pants, and boots.



February 14th – Annual maintenance and flow test for all Lockhart Fire Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) as required by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP).



March 1st – Lockhart Fire Rescue transitioned to ESO, a new Record Management System for documenting all responses to incidents, state reporting, training, fire hydrants, activities, and events, etc.

March – Lockhart Fire Rescue performed the annual maintenance on the 892 fire hydrants in the City of Lockhart. The list of needed repairs are forwarded to Public Works for repair.



March 6th– A group from Texas Municipal League (TML) led by Mayor Lew White visited Fire Station #1 and was given a tour of the new 75' Aerial Apparatus – Quint 2.



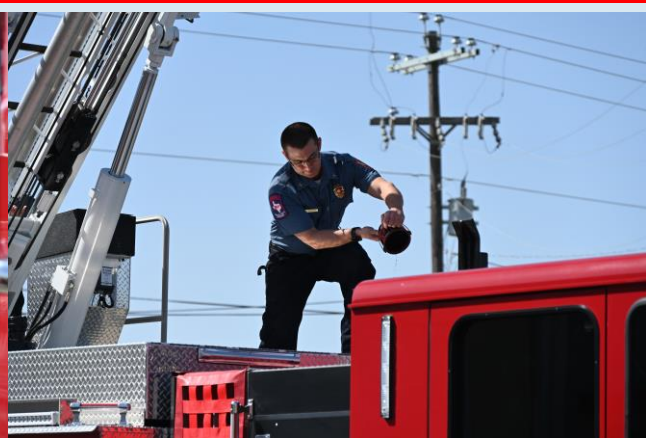
March 4th – City Council approved the purchase of a “Weis Quick Attack” fire apparatus equipped with a 400 gallon water tank, 7.3L V-8 gasoline engine, super single tire conversion, 3” lift kit, skid plates, 20HP Honda fire pump, stainless steel plumbing, 100’ booster reel, foam system, ground sweeps, three whip lines, portable winch, emergency lighting, and equipment storage compartments. The cost is \$291,965 and funded primarily with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds.

March 21st – Lockhart Fire Rescue held a “Push-In Ceremony” at Fire Station #2 for the 75’ Aerial apparatus received on December 27th, 2024. The tradition comes from the early 1900’s when the firefighters would push the horse driven fire wagon back into the fire station after the horses were removed from the fire wagon. The fire departments 1921 American LaFrance was also on display.
