






MISSION

Goal: Turnout in 1 Minute and 20 Seconds or Less for 90% of Emergency Incidents



2nd Quarter 2022

March 30th thru April 3rd – Lockhart Fire Captains Kevin Leclerc and Johnathon Hernandez attended a wildland training class sponsored by Texas A&M Forest Service.

April 1st – Lockhart Fire Chief Randy Jenkins and Assistant Fire Chief Ryan Bergerson participated in the "50 Lions Who Can Cook" fundraiser for Lockhart ISD.



April 7th – The City of Lockhart hired Insurance Services Office (ISO) consultant Mike Pietsch Consulting to develop a plan to assist the city in maintaining an ISO Public Protection Classification (PPC) of 3/3X. The plan was developed and submitted to ISO for their review and accepted.

April 9th – Lockhart Fire held an entrance civil service test and a physical agility test for firefighter recruits.

April 15th – Lockhart Fire participated in an easter egg hunt at Golden Age Assisted Living at 1505 S. Main St.



April 19th – A Girl Scout Troop took a tour of Fire Station #1 and learned about the fire service and 911.





2nd Quarter 2022

April – Lockhart Fire Rescue completed the annual maintenance on the 813 fire Hydrants in Lockhart.



April 19th – Lockhart Jr. High held a career day and First Responder car show. Fire Department was voted the student favorite.



May 5th – Lockhart Fire Rescue applied for and was granted a Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) Community Development Partnership Program Grant for swift water and rope rescue equipment in the amount of \$6,649.



2nd Quarter 2022

May 17th-19th – Fire Chief Randy Jenkins and Captain Kevin Leclerc attended the TEEX Leadership Symposium in San Marcos.

May 23rd – Lockhart Fire Rescue applied for and was granted a Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation Grant for battery powered extrication tools to include a spreader, cutter, and ram. The non-matching grant was for \$29,780.



March – Clearfork, Navarro, and Plum Creek Elementaries took field trips to Fire Station #1 to look at the equipment and talk to the Firefighters.





Lockhart Fire Rescue 2nd Quarter 2022

May 18th – Annual apparatus pump test and inspection of all Lockhart Fire ground ladders. Engine 1, Engine 4, Engine 2, and Rescue 1 were pump tested and 8 ground ladders for a total of 166'.



June 6th - 7th – Training days at the Buda Fire Training Field. Training areas included mask up drills, ladder deployment, repelling and high angle rescue operations.





2nd Quarter 2022

June 9th -11th – Lockhart Fire participated in the Chisholm Trail Roundup parade and did first-aid standby for the three days of the Chisholm Trail Roundup.



June 17th – Lockhart Fire participated in the annual Juneteenth celebrations at Old Carver School at 1104 E. Market St.

June 20th – A motor vehicle accident (MVA) involving a Maxwell Fire Brush Truck and an automobile at the intersection of San Jacinto St. and State Park Rd. in Lockhart resulted in the Line of Duty Death (LODD) of two Maxwell Firefighters returning from a Wildfire incident. The two firefighters were brothers Jonathon Coco, and Hunter Coco.

June 28th – Assistant Chief Ryan Bergerson and Captain Leclerc drove to Houston to pick up a new Frazer Ambulance approved by the City of Lockhart and Caldwell County for Lockhart EMS on May 13, 2022.



June 28th – The Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP) visited Lockhart Fire for its biennial compliance inspection.
