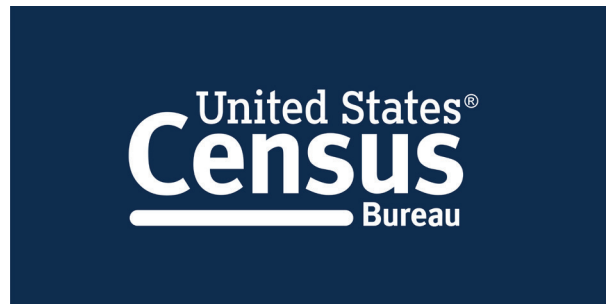

Complete the Census by September 30

The last day to respond to the 2020 US Census is Sept. 30, which is also the day Census enumerators are scheduled to stop going door to door.

Over the next decade, lawmakers, business owners, and others will use 2020 Census data to make critical decisions. The results will show where communities need new schools, new clinics, new roads, and more services for families, older



adults, and children.

The results will also inform how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding are allocated to more than 100 programs, including Medicaid, Head Start, block grants for commu-

nity mental health services, and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, also known as SNAP.

Sojak to preside as judge

The Lockhart City Council has appointed an experienced local attorney to preside as judge at Lockhart Municipal Court.

Red Rock lawyer Darlon Sojak, whose work as a lawyer includes serving the public as a court-appointed defense attorney in Caldwell County and managing his own law firm for more than a decade, was appointed as presiding judge for the Lockhart Municipal Court at Tuesday night's meeting of the Lockhart City Council.

Sojak's law experience also includes working as a municipal



court prosecutor for the City of Sundown, Texas.

Sojak graduated in 1993 from The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley and taught ninth-grade English for five years before pivoting into law. He graduated from Texas Tech University School of Law in 2002.

Sojak will succeed Frank Coggins, who recently retired.

Street improvements in progress

A project to improve several city streets in Lockhart is currently underway.

The approximately \$383,000 project, which was approved in July by Lockhart City Council, involves enhancements that include resurfacing to South Main Street from Center Street to State Park Road, South Commerce Street from Pin

Oak Street to Blackjack Street, South Blanco Street from West San Antonio Street to Prairie Lea Street, West Prairie Lea Street from South Blanco Street to South Church Street, and Bee Street from South Guadalupe Street to South Commerce Street.

The project is expected to be complete by late September.

Program brings COVID relief to businesses

The COVID-19 Recovery Loan program was created in April, making zero interest loans of up to \$5,000 or \$7,500 available to non-essential businesses.

for the loan will remain open until Sept. 30, 2020, until funding has been exhausted, or until the city determines the program goals have been satisfied.

All loans have a 36-month repayment

schedule and will not be charged interest if paid in full by the maturity date.

A promissory note must be executed. No payments are required prior to Oct. 1, 2020.

While Lockhart ISD instruction will begin online on Aug. 24, students are scheduled to begin returning to campus on Sept. 14.

With an expected increase in bicycle, motor vehicle and pedestrian traffic in and around the schools, the Lockhart Police Department would like to remind everyone that State Law prohibits the use of cell phones while driving in marked school zones - this includes text messaging.

Remember, the speed limit in school zones is 20 miles per hour.
