Downtown revitalization planning process begins

Improvements are in store for Downtown Lockhart.

In the August 3rd City Council meeting, Councilmembers gave TRC Engineers, Inc. the green light to move forward with conceptual design alternatives focusing on the nineblock area around the Caldwell County Courthouse. That area is defined by Walnut St. to the north, Colorado St./U.S. 183 to the east, Prairie Lea St. to the south, and Church St. to



the west. Proposed upgrades include utilities, drainage, sidewalks, pedestrian access, parking, and landscaping. There will also be a traffic study done on N. Main St. between San

Antonio and Walnut Streets.

TRC will host two public forums to gather feedback from the community and property owners. The dates will be announced soon.

New LFD fire truck en route to Lockhart



The Lockhart Fire Department's newest fire truck is on its way!

The new pumper is currently being built and is on schedule to arrive late-September. It will replace Fire Engine 4, which has been deployed to numerous fires, medical calls, and wrecks since 2010. According to the National Fire Protection Association, it is considered best practice to place a fire truck on reserve after 10 years in the front lines. Therefore, Engine 4 will be kept on reserve, while the new vehicle will be used in emergency response.

While similar to Engine 4, the new fire truck features three pre-connected fire hoses for quick water deployment, air bags for firefighter safety, and a cab intercom system.

Street improvements underway this month

Twelve City Streets are about to get some needed repairs.

Lockhart City Council awarded Lone Star Paving of Austin the contract to resurface those streets.

The streets included in the project are:

- Pendergrass St. from San Jacinto St. to Bluestem Dr
- Lakeview Drive from San Jacinto St. to Bluestem Dr
- Bluestem Dr. from Pendergrass St. to Lakeview Dr.

- Nueces St. from W. San Antonio St. to Bois D'Arc St.
- Sunset Dr. from S.
 Colorado St. to end.
- La Feliciana Dr. from Clearfork St. to end.
- Aransas St. from White Oak St. to south end.
- Laredo St. from N.
 Commerce St. to N. Colorado St.
- 2nd St. from Neches St. to Chihuahua St.
- 3rd St. from Neches St. to Chihuahua St.
- 4th St. from Neches St. to Chihuahua St.

 Monterrey St. from Neches St. to Chihuahua St

The \$488,740 project also includes repaving the Municipal Court's parking lot.

If your street is included in the project, the City will notify you of upcoming construction ahead of time. Once roadwork begins, please take the necessary safety precautions to keep yourself, your neighbors, and work crews safe:

- Slow down
- Pay attention to road signs, construction equipment, and person-

- nel
- Allow for extra travel time
- Plan an alternative route

Weather permitting, the City anticipates the project to be completed by October.

Solid waste services UPDATE: New pick up time and no glass for recycling

Starting August 16, trash and recycling carts will need to be placed at the curb by 7 a.m. on collection days. You may also have up to seven bags, in addition to your cart, ready for pick up--for no extra charge. Also, make sure your items are placed within five feet of the roadway without obstructing traffic flow for both vehicles and pedestrians.

At that same date, glass will no longer be accepted for recycling. This applies to both curbside and drop offs at the Lockhart Recycling Center.

Instead, here are some ways you can dispose of glass safely:

- Wrap the item in duct tape, cloth, or an old newspaper to keep them from breaking during transit.
- If it's broken glass, place it in a cardboard box or a container.
- Place glass items in your brown cart.
- Give them away to a friend or donate it to a charitable organization.
- Take them to the 130 Environmental Park landfill.

**Even with these changes, "At-the-Door" valet garbage services will still be available to our disabled customers at no additional charge. If you are eligible, you may pick up an application from our Utilities Department, then submit it with a doctor's note. That application is also available on our website: lockhart-tx.org. Questions?
